NAU Transfer Plans are a unique tool designed to help guide your academic journey from community college to NAU.

To be completed at the Community College:

☐ Associate of Applied Science in Allied Health Field:

Students must complete an associate degree at a regionally accredited community college or university in an allied health discipline and have a current state or national license that matches their allied health associate degree. Students may begin coursework at NAU while their associate degree and license are still in progress, but both must be obtained prior to enrollment in the final capstone course at NAU. Possible discipline or emphases include:

- Diagnostic Medical Imaging and Therapy
- General Allied Health
- Medical Assisting
- Paramedic Care
- Physical Therapist Assisting
- Respiratory Care
- Surgical Technology
- Occupational Therapy Associate

☐ [AGEC](#) Requirements: What is an AGECE? The Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGECE) is the foundation of a community college education in Arizona. Successfully completing the AGECE means all AGECE courses will transfer as a block to NAU. An AGECE is incorporated into some Associate degrees, and some degree requirements will also meet AGECE requirements.

☐ Additional course requirements that can be completed at the community college level:

HS 205 Foundations of Public Health

PSY 101 Introduction to Psychology

These courses are prerequisites for required NAU courses.
