Years of Experience

More Practices Implemented



As novice faculty are still developing their craft, they may be more open to learning new approaches and changing their teaching methods. As for their more mature colleagues, they too find value in comprehensive courses in effective teaching practices, but often implement new tactics at a slower pace.

Job-Embedded

More Practices Implemented



As a reflection of their current job responsibilities, faculty who are teaching while completing ACUE courses implement more new teaching approaches than administrators or others who are not teaching while completing ACUE courses.



Factor #3
Job Stability

More Practices Implemented



Generally, full-time, non-tenure track faculty implement fewer new approaches. Incentives, such as considering the certification in contract renewals or stipends that allow them to earn the same salary while reducing their teaching load, could increase implementation.

Teaching Loads

More Practices Implemented



Faculty who teach fewer than 50 students per year implement more new teaching techniques.

More Practices Implemented



Faculty are more likely to implement new practices when they understand the rationale. ACUE's information sessions and course launches are helpful, as they make expectations clear and emphasize the benefits of implementation.

Formative Feedback From ACUE's Student Survey
More Practices Implemented



Receiving formative student feedback encourages faculty to adjust their teaching and implement more practices, as they learn about areas where students have noticed their efforts and where there is likely room for improvement.

Quality Facilitation
More Practices Implemented



Faculty supported by facilitators, who make greater use of the coaching resources provided by ACUE, implement more evidence-based teaching practices.

7.5 Factor #8
Engaged Faculty
More Practices Implemented



Faculty engagement is positively associated with change in practice. With ACUE, when faculty are engaged, so are their students. **Tip**: Drive faculty to use course features, such as the "note to self" feature.
