

Our condolences to the families of these NAU retirees, spouses, and faculty members who have recently passed away in 2018 –2019. (Information is from published obituaries except where noted.) If you know of a retiree or spouse who has died, please contact Sherry Markel : Sherry.Markel@nau.edu.

Dr. Robert Fredrick Boothe, Sr, 94, passed away on December 5th, 2018, in Flagstaff, Arizona. Robert (Bob) was born August 30th, 1924 in Brush, Co. He graduated from Central Missouri State College with a B.S. in Mathematics in Education in 1950. He earned his M.Ed. & Ed.D. from University of Missouri in 1959. He became a distinguished professor of education at Northern Arizona University and served as Department Chair of the College's Educational Administration Department for 12 years. He was awarded Professor Emeritus after serving 30 years at Northern Arizona University. One of his strongest character traits was his ability to empathize with those he met. He was a very caring and compassionate person, humorist, champion of social consciousness and always put the needs of others before his own. He was a natural born leader. A proud patriot and U.S. Marine veteran. He was a cherished husband, beloved father, grandfather, and great grandfather as well as a great friend to many.

David Eagleburger passed away December 27, 2018. David earned both his undergraduate and master's degrees at NAU and worked with the Mesa School district, becoming the Associate Superintendent in one of the country's largest school districts.

Jay Ferguson and Vergie Ferguson. Vergie Rae Vest Ferguson, 89, passed away on Tuesday, October 16, 2018 in Phoenix, AZ, after a brave battle with leukemia. Her husband, Jay Edward Ferguson, 92, joined her in death twelve days later, Sunday, October 28. They met at U of A and were married in Safford, AZ on June 11, 1947. In 1968 they moved to Flagstaff and during the next 35 years, Jay worked for Black Mesa Pipeline Company and then NAU, as a pilot, and was active in the Kiwanis Club. Vergie was an administrative assistant in the Department of Music and later the Department of Modern Languages at NAU.

Charles Hirshouer passed away December 24, 2018, after a long battle with illness. Born in Columbus Ohio, Chuck moved to Tucson, AZ as a child. Eventually, Chuck moved to Flagstaff, AZ where he worked at NAU in Capital Assets, Transportation Services until his retirement.

Marilyn Kostka passed away in Austin, Tx, February 14, 2019. Marilyn earned her undergraduate, master's and doctorate degrees in music at UT, Austin. She married Stefan Kostka in 1962. In 1993 Marilyn moved to Flagstaff, Arizona, as a professor of music education at Northern Arizona University until her retirement in 2008. She became deeply involved in research and writing in the field of music education. She was published frequently and recognized nationally for her contributions to the field of music education and pedagogy, particularly in the area of elementary music education, one of her deepest passions.

Philip Swanson passed away November 30, 2018, in Tucson, AZ. Philip had an extensive career as a professional orchestral flutist, university professor, solo and chamber music performer, private and masterclass teacher/clinician and as a university music/fine arts administrator. His teaching and administrative career in higher education included full-time appointments at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, the University of Arizona, the Eastman School of Music, the University of Redlands and Northern Arizona University. As an orchestral flutist, Philip held positions as principal flutist with the North Carolina Symphony, Tucson Symphony Orchestra, Arizona Chamber Orchestra, Arizona Opera Company Orchestra, Flagstaff Summer Festival Orchestra, Flagstaff Symphony, Redlands Symphony Orchestra, Riverside County Philharmonic, Lake Arrowhead Festival Orchestra and the Desert Symphony. In addition, he held positions as piccoloist/flutist with the San Antonio Symphony Orchestra and the Santa Fe Opera Orchestra. Philip was one of the founders of the National Flute Association, where he served as its first treasurer, co-chair of the program committee for the first convention and a member of the board of directors for many years.

Harry "Gene" Westerhaus longtime Flagstaff resident and NAURA member, passed away at the age of 87 in Phoenix, December 5, 2018.

John Wettaw passed away December 16, 2018. John moved to Flagstaff in 1967 and taught chemistry at NAU for 47 years before he retired in 2014. In recognition of his services to the university, where he is said to have taught more than 15,000 students, the NAU Biology and Biochemistry building was named after him in 1999. During his time teaching, John also became the longest-serving Republican state legislator in Arizona history, serving 20 years in the Arizona House of Representatives and eight in the senate. He advocated for higher education and improvements to the state's physical infrastructure, while also securing funding for NAU's biochemistry building and the Walkup Skydome.

George Williams passed away December 5, 2018 at his second home in Baja, Mexico. George was born September 1, 1929 in Morrill, Nebraska. George retired from Northern Arizona University, Flagstaff, Arizona, in 1992, where he had been a purchasing agent. He was a member of the NAU Retirees Association and served as its president. He later moved to Lakeside, Arizona, and at the age of 87 he built a new home which included his "dream workshop". Anyone who knew George can attest to his sunny disposition, his positive outlook on life, and his love of friends and family. He was always willing to pitch in and help out.

Jennifer and her husband, John have been married for 22 years. They have 3 furry children—2 cats (Mary and Chad) and a Boston Terrier


