

## **Tozan Kilns and Japanese Teahouse Tour**

My anticipation of the Tozan Kilns and Japanese Teahouse tour was well rewarded. Shannan, a gracious host and Jason, our tour guide, had so much information to share with all of us. Standing under the roof, watching a small stream flow down the dirt steps as rain and hail played on the roof while we awaited Jason's arrival added a touch more magic for me. Learning about the kilns was of interest to me as I had visited the ceramic studio several times a few years back when one of the students I worked closely with had her work on display. To learn more of the process of her work, of which I have several pieces, gives her work even more meaning. I sip my morning tea from her cup with even more gratitude now. It is daunting to consider the time and attention it takes to fire up the largest kiln. The amount of wood it takes just to fire up the smaller wood kilns is quite remarkable. The new Train kiln invented by one of Jason's graduate assistants ties the old ways to new innovation. That there is access to three types of kilns – the wood kilns, the natural gas and the electric kilns – is quite a remarkable gift to the NAU and Flagstaff communities.

While I knew of the Tozan Kilns, I did not know NAU had a Japanese Teahouse until I received Shannan's invitation. I have experienced two Japanese tea ceremonies in Denver and was surprised to learn that the traditions here at NAU's teahouse were just a bit different. One of the goals of the College of Education during my time there was to teach and model life-long learning. Thank you, Shannan, for providing us NAU retirees with opportunities to do just that!

After serving in the military he joined Arthur Andersen and Company as an Accountant, Auditor, and Consultant in 1952 and had a distinguished 40 year career as an accountant and consultant. He transferred with the firm to Phoenix in 1958 and opened Andersen's Phoenix office. He is a past chairman of the Arizona Society of Certified Public Accountants.
