#### Accelerated Masters option:

\*This program is available as an Accelerated Undergraduate/Graduate Plan wherein a student may start a master's degree while simultaneously completing their bachelor's degree.

Be aware that some courses may have prerequisites that you must also successfully complete. For prerequisite information, click on the course or see your advisor.

#### PROCESS To enter the accelerated MOL program:

- Students will apply to the graduate degree once 12 NAU credits have been completed.
- Select the graduate start term to be 1 semester after the student plans to graduate.
- In order to enroll in JUS 510 and JUS 560 students will need to be admitted to the graduate college.
- Students will need to earn either an A or B in JUS 510 and JUS 560 in order for it to count.
- Students are charged undergraduate tuition while taking the graduate level coursework in their bachelor's degree.
- Once bachelor degree is completed and posted, students will only have 8 classes remaining to complete the master's degree.
- \*JUS 510 (Theories in Criminality in Justice Studies) sub for JUS 436
- \*JUS 560 (Ethics in Justice Administration) sub for JUS 411
