To be completed at the Community College:

☐ Associate degree coursework. 64 units in an associate's degree transfer block. If you have been awarded an AAS degree from an accredited Arizona community college, NAU will accept up to 75 transfer units.		
Students must have an associate degree, either completed or in progress, from a regionally accredited institution and the associate degree must be completed prior to the awarding of the BAS degree. The associate degree may be in any field within 10 years of your application to NAU.		
☐ AGEC Requirements: What is an AGEC? The Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) is a 35 unit general education block that fulfills the same lower division general education requirement at all three state universities. May be incorporated into your associate's degree. Follow hyperlink for more information.

You may take these remaining courses from any of the academic areas, using these courses to pursue your specific interests and goals. You may also use prerequisites or transfer credits as electives if they weren't used to meet major, minor, or liberal studies requirements.

We encourage you to consult with your advisor to select the courses that will be most advantageous to you.

Accelerated Masters option:

With our 4+1 structure (4-year Bachelor's degree and 1-year Master's degree), a student can earn an undergraduate business degree in four years and with only one additional year of study, earn a Master of Global Business Administration degree.
