

USING THE SNIPPING TOOL

Have you ever been asked to send a screenshot of something? With Windows 7, you can use the Snipping Tool to capture screen images and paste them into your documents, email or presentations. Here's how to use a free tool on your machine to grab screenshots.

1. Find the Snipping Tool in Start menu/All Programs/Accessories/Snipping Tool



NOTE: If you like it, drag it to the taskbar, or Right-click and choose Pin to Start Menu.

- 2. Open the tool
- 3. Make sure that what you want to capture is onscreen.
- 4. Click the down-arrow beside the **New** button and choose the type of capture you want.



- a. For **Free-form Snip** or **Rectangular Snip**, hold down the left mouse button and drag around the area you want: a red line marks your progress.
- b. To snip a Window, just click on the screen.
- c. If you choose **Full-screen Snip**, an image of the screen immediately appears.
- 5. The Snipping Tool Window appears. It displays your image for saving or marking up. But you don't have to do anything else: your image is already saved in the Windows clipboard. You can paste the image into your document (Use Edit/Paste or Ctrl –V).
