

Louie Academic Catalog Transcript

Let's take a look at how to use the NAU Academic Catalog. Navigate to nau.edu/catalog.

Here you can search for degrees, courses, and academic policies. Today we will focus on looking at degrees and their requirements.

Click "degree search". First, you'll want to make sure you're in the correct catalog year using the drop down in the upper right-hand corner. Your catalog year is typically the first year you attended NAU. You can search for specific degrees under "enter search term" or select a category if you are browsing or exploring. You can also select "Online Only" or "By Campus" if you are interested in statewide options.

For this example, let's use the "Categories" function and select "Business". Then you will want to filter by "type" and "campus" to make sure you're looking at the right programs for you. Let's select "Bachelor's" and "Flagstaff Mountain".

Click to learn more about Business Economics, and then you can read about potential careers, an overview of degree requirements under the "overview" section - in this section you'll also notice you can link to the 4-year progression plan with the recommended sequence of classes. Lastly, if you click on "details" you can see all of the specifics about the requirements and courses you'll need for this degree. This tool is an excellent resource to understand your degree requirements or explore majors, minors, or certificates.
