Chair Marks: For all clubs, organizations and individuals here today, thank you for being with us! When I call your name please come to the podium and give us about a 2-minute-long description of what the funding is for or why you would like to become a club and how it will benefit the student body. All questions will be saved for the voting period.

**Item A:** Club Recognition: Society for Ecological Restoration NAU Student Association

Speaker: Hello. I am a graduate student member of the Society for Ecological Restoration. We want to start a NAU chapter of SER just because there has been a lot of interest from undergraduate and graduate students in getting involved in restoration projects and many don't even know what kinds of restoration

projects are even going on in Flagstaff and on the NAU campus so its just going to be a way to connect restoration professionals and graduate student projects that are going on with undergraduate students who are looking to get that experience. We will have an official affiliation with the Society for Ecological Restoration and with the Southwest Regional chapter. One of our advisors is a part of the Southwest board so she has a lot of knowledge about the things that go on and good connections with different projects. We also have been doing some outreach with organizations that work with high school students and doing native gardenings on different school campuses and establishing greenhouses and things like that. Mostly its just a chance for students to get experience with doing these projects and figure out if they like it and get it on their resume.

Item B: Club Recognition: Christians United for Israel at Northern Arizona University

Speakers: I am starting up this Christians United for Israel at Northern Arizona University and the purpose of this organization is to get more students involved. Our purpose in this is just to involve students from around campus, especially target Christian students from around campus to just kind of gain more support and give them more information about what actually is going on in Israel because Israel has a lot of enemies, especially the media, and we want to inform people about what actually is going on there and kind of what they are facing and what we can do to raise awareness for that. Christians United for Israel, the mother organization, is actually the biggest provost organization in the United States and it is very politically influential so our hope is we can help people who are voting. Things we are looking into doing are tabling on campus, campaigns with other coordinators, and just basically inform people. It's not to cause a ruckus or anything but only to let people know.

Item C: Club Recognition: NAU Mock Trial Club

Speaker: Hello. I'm starting the NAU Mock Trial Club and the main purpose of the NAU Mock Trial Club would be to compete in the American College Mock Trial Association's competition. They have a regional district and national competition. Several students have expressed interest in being in a mock trial club kind of to help towards pre-law stuff since a lot of it is learning about how the court system works and how you can introduce evidence and what is admissible in court and what isn't. It's almost like acting. You pretend to be a lawyer or you pretend to be a witness and you represent different sides in civil and criminal cases. So the main purpose would be to compete in this competition and teach students about law so hopefully they can go to law school but just for anyone whose interested in learning about the legal system.

Item D: Club Recognition: NAU En Pointe

Speaker: I would like to start this club because we have a gap in our dance programs here. With the Bad Jacks program we have jazz and hip hop but we have no official ballet which is a critical part of anyone's dance training whether or not you want to pursue a professional career. We would like to create this space for anyone who has spent time, especially all throughout high school, who have had ballet training but since coming up here have not had space to continue their training and for anyone up here who has wanted to start but has not quite found the right group. It is very much a space of creativity, a space of learning all of the different disciplines that come with it but also having a really nice time getting to be with a group of people who are here for the discipline of ballet.

Item E: Club Recognition: Northern Arizona University Citizens' Climate Lobby

Speaker: I am currently an intern for our Flagstaff chapter of Citizens' Climate Lobby and basically CCL's goal is to have some sort of climate action and so things we do in our Flagstaff chapter, we kind of do the same as we do in our NAU chapter but I wanted to get more of a student life and younger people involved. It wouldn't be for anybody who wants climate action, but it could be for anyone who is interested in lobbying or having any attention towards any political item they want addressed.

It will be the first college chapter inside U.N.I.T.Y.'s organization and it really does help foster the youth to go into leadership so that is mostly about my club.
