Call to the Audience

Speaker: We are here to talk about LEAF (Lumberjack Emergency Assistance Fund) which provides a safety net for students in crisis. More students are facing unexpected financial crises due to the ongoing covid crisis. In Spring 2020, ASNAU provided \$50,000 to LEAF, and in Spring 2021 ASNAU provided \$100,000 to LEAF- which reduced barriers for 400 students. However, the LEAF fund is empty, and we were only able to meet 8 of the 21 applications this week before it ran dry. We're still working hard to raise more funds for LEAF, but we need your help to sustain LEAF right now.

Discussion:

Senator Arnold: Last year we were able to donate \$100,000 because it came from our carnival budget line, is there a certain spot we could pull from this year?

President Acosta: We have over \$200,000 in rollover, we'll pull from that. We will wait to look at the budget next week before we make any final decisions.

Senator Arnold: Could I propose donating \$125,000?

Vice Chair Carter: How is the university administrations helping LEAF, if they even are?

Speaker: The fund is 100% donor funded, it's not an administrative fund.

Vice Chair Carter: Are you actively seeking more donations from the foundations or administrators? Is this LEAF fund going to be discontinued after the pandemic?

Speaker: No one has stopped donating and we are actively fundraising for funds at all times but once the money comes in it goes out to students, there are no barriers. The fund is administered

by the office of Dean of Students, and they're heavily involved in making sure the students are aware of the grant. The LEAF fund will hopefully create sustainability for students but we are still facing an unprecedented need. We will always be fundraising as long as it's needed.

Advisor Gavin: Most of these crises are related to Covid which is why there used to be only a handful in the past but a huge increase in need now. So I hope we can get to a place where only a few students need it again.

Chief of Staff Varner: I would love to help out again but I think we should see our budget first to make sure we don't promise money we can't donate.

It was brought to my attention and I would like to let everyone know that it would be best to avoid using that term. It is a shortcut that can cause some confusion for the motion/and or discussion, so it would be best to continue to use "I move to..." or "I second..." Secondly, I have formatted a new excel sheet in the ASNAU home tab on Microsoft teams. The new sheet is the Reimbursement tracker for the 2021-2022 senate year. This will be used to input the bills that we vote upon during meetings. I have started to input the bills that have already been voted on and passed. There is some information that I do not have to completely fill out all the columns on the table, that will need to be updated. If there are any more questions you have about that sheet please let me know. Third, on the list is, I have noticed that there are a lot of laptops out during the meeting, which can cause distraction, and would be rude if you were doing side work on it while another person was speaking. So if we could keep them closed or put them away until you need to use them, that would be greatly appreciated. Committee Reports

We passed Senate Bills 34-6 and 34-7. We are still currently working on the new reimbursement application and hoping to have it completed within the next week or two. I am also going through the bylaws, constitution, and old reimbursement packets for reference to make the process better.

b. Legislative Committee: Senator Handlong

Senator Handlong: We added these changes to help clarify and specify what this section was saying. We made section A and B symmetrical so they could mimic each other and flow better. We also added “ASNAU” in front of Senate and President to make sure that was clarified. We changed some wording so the terms weren’t confusing. The highlight sections are what we added into this bylaw.

Article XXVI Section 11:

11. Each Justice, serving as the judicial liaisons for ASNAU, shall:

a. Register with the Office of the Vice Provost of Academic Affairs to serve on NAU’s Academic Integrity Hearing Board and, from time to time, will serve as a student representative on the Academic Integrity Hearing Board.

i. Each Justice is required to reach out to the Academic Integrity Hearing Board **to become a member of the Committee** within 30 days of their appointment.

ii. If selected, each Justice is required to serve as the student representative on at least one Academic Integrity Hearing in the Academic

Year.

1. After serving as the student representative on any Academic Integrity Hearing, the serving Justice is required to report to the ASNAU Senate and the ASNAU President of their service within 30 days of their service.

b. Register with Parking and Transit Services to serve as a student representative on the Parking Appeal and Diversion Committee.

i. Each Justice is required to contact the Assistant Director of Parking and Transit Services to become a member of the Committee within 30 days of their appointment.

ii. If selected, each Justice is required to serve as the student representative on at least one Parking Appeal and Diversion Committee Meeting in the Academic Year.

1. After serving as the student representative on any Parking Appeal and Diversion Committee, the serving Justice is required to report to the ASNAU Senate and the ASNAU President of their service within 30 days of their service.

Senator Davidson: NAU makes most of their money off the freshman meal plans and housing.

Senator Fox: I agree with this issue, I would give away my transfers because I didn't want them to go to waste. But I wouldn't want to go up against the University but I do think we could think of other solutions, especially because there are not enough dietary allowances with the meal plans. So thank you for bringing this up.

Senator Massey: I also wasted a lot of money with the dining dollar meal plan, I wasted \$300 on starbucks cups because it would've just disappeared either way.

SSA Best: We do have an Advocacy Committee to look at issues like this so there is a little bit of hope for you if you want to go there as well.
