Call to the Audience

Speaker John Georgas: I would like to talk to you all about NAU's multiterm enrollment or

registration system, and how we manage enrollment windows for students. We want to go from

two separate enrollment periods to a single enrollment period which would open in mid spring

and run all the way through the beginning of the subsequent spring semester. And in that window

students can enroll for the fall, winter, and spring classes all in the same window. We wanted to

improve student retention, and we're seeing that since it's difficult to plan a year and a half

ahead, students 'schedules change more than they used to for spring. Right now we're

considering scrapping multiterm enrollment, and bringing back the two separate enrollments and

exploring new ways for students to get into the classes they need.

Speaker John Georgas: We would plan to go back to the system before Spring of 2018 in which

the spring enrollment period would open around March and stay open through the add/drop

deadline for the subsequent fall. Let's continue to stay connected and I'd be happy to speak to

you all again.

Item A: Election Day Resolution

VPGA Billings brings back the Election Day Resolution from previous Senators who passed the

resolution calling for faculty to not punish for missing class on election day, specifically Federal

Elections. An added section from the previous resolution, is that it will classify as a continuing

Wow, it's been a little rocky these first days of school. I would like to encourage you all to remember to practice self care, please. Let's just take a moment to take a deep breath. President's Steering Committee- It's been interesting to hear that ODOS hasn't received many incident reports regarding mask wearing. The only reports that have been processed are because students have filed them complaining about faculty. With that being said, remember we are role models and to hold your peers accountable. Information Security-The Jackscard has been a success thus far. I am working with ITS to create an informational TikTok. If you get questions about it direct students to the Jackscard site but essentially, it's still available for Apple, if your phone dies it can still scan for 5 hours, and if you get the digital card the physical one no longer works. If you agree to the two-step verification (DUO) you will no longer have to change your password every semester. Roadmapping Committee-I am looking for 3 people (potentially only one or two representatives from ASNAU) that have an interest to serve on President Cruz-Rivera's Roadmapping Subcommittees, raise your hand if you would like to receive an email with more information. Housing- Many of you have probably heard or seen memes about NAU placing students in temporary housing. This is true. Housing has seen an increase of 122% in housing applications compared to last year. RA's have been asked to share their space to accommodate the influx and will receive \$20/day per day that they have a roommate. There are also students being placed in spaces that were formerly used

as gyms. My concern was that students were not being disclosed of this before arriving but I have been informed that these students have been fully disclosed and that they usually tend to prefer these spaces because of the larger space compared to traditional dorms.

Open Forum

VPSA Kavanagh: We started CHQ hours this week. However, we already have four senators abandoning their shifts. I have sent two sechuales and you all confirmed your commitment and tried to keep communication open. CHQ staff cannot fulfill all hours by themself making it crucial you all attend. Our bylaws state that each Senator will work a minimum of one hour in CHQ, not fulfilling these duties puts you in line for possible suspension or impeachment. We are now creating an attendance sheet on Teams, where we log the absences. CHQ is a mandatory duty as a Senator.

Senate Chair Bolar: Senators, as mentioned in the bylaws, you have 6 absence points. An unexcused absence from the Senate is a whole 3 points, and missing your CHQ hour will be worth 1 point.

Diversity Coordinator Palma: I have been in contact with the inclusion coordinator, and he wanted me to promote Study Break Dialog with NAUPDon, next Wednesday, September 8th. From 3pm - 5pm at the IMQ Student Center if you are interested. Also I can send over more information on events revolving around Latinx Heritage month.

Senate Chair Bolar: If you would like to be on New Business please go through myself, the Senate Clerk, or Senate Parliamentarian. We are dealing with the agendas, and putting everyone who wants to be on New Business on there. We can even put something you want on there for future Senate Meeting, even if it's in let's say, April. Just let me know sometime before 5:00pm on the Wednesday before the following Senate because that is the deadline. That would give you

Senator Stempak: Can we revisit the campus student housing crisis? What is community housing, and how can we evaluate how the students feel living like that?

Senator Arnold: I'm not sure what we can do. It just seems like there is limited availability.

President Acosta: I have been trying to find a way to help for a while now, but I think we can

create an RA council, since they are the ones experiencing the changes and working directly with

residents.

VPGA Billings: I have been talking with Megan Gavin about these issues, and spitballed maybe moving to alternative housing? But it comes with lots of logistic issues such as security, and privacy.

Senate Chair Bolar: To clarify an answer to the earlier question, do you have a definition for what community housing is?

President Acosta: Transforming gyms into bed spaces.

VPSA Kavanagh: Does anyone know where the fault was?

Executive Assistant Gilbert: Based off the last administration, they didn't do the best planning. They followed the statistics at the time showing lower enrollment and admissions and allowed residents to buy out rooms prior to moving in. We had to go back and try to convince students to take on a roommate and refund them but most still say no.

VPSA Kavanagh: Is it true they won't allow three beds in a room now?

Executive Assistant Gilbert: Yes.

Senator Fox: I am wondering how the University responded. Was there a public apology or will they ever make one? No student or RA should go through this and I think they deserve that apology.

Senator Kolasinski: How was the \$40 compensation decided?

Executive Assistant Gilbert: RA's were not really informed but reach out to RO for clarification.

Senator Handlong: RA's were asked without apology to share rooms and given compensation of

\$20 a day to share a room with coworkers or have a freshman move in with them.

Senator Stempak: Thank you everybody. Let's hold people accountable so it doesn't happen again in the future. I yield my time.

VPGA Billings: To clarify, when we said administrations we meant department level not presidential transitions. These decisions were made since housing opened even before our fake spring break happened.

Senator Cinader: Do the students living in community housing still have to pay?

Executive Assistant Gilbert: Yes. However, they are trying their best to move students out of community housing. They are going off of what rooms open and become available if students drop out or decide to take a roommate.

Senate Chair Bolar: Is there a spot in their contracts for that to change?

VPSA Kavanagh: Does anyone know how many students are displaced?

VPGA Billings: Point of order- one person speaks at a time!

Executive Assistant Gilbert: We can't share that information.

CHQ Manager Burich: Is there a way to close off the hotel for just students?

VPGA Billings: No.

Senator Fox: I still think the students and RA's deserve an apology. Is there a chance for a possible resolution ASNAU could write that would address this issue so more students become aware of it?

Senator Kolasinski: How do you know who moves first when rooms become available and why? Executive Assistant Gilbert: We can't disclose any information on that.

Chief of Staff Varner: Like what Senator Fox said, our last ASNAU President Joe Carter sent out an email addressing major issues and we made statements on social media to be emailed out to students. We could say something and show students that we acknowledge the housing issue and look into it. I yield my time.

Senator Arnold: Personally, I don't think issuing an apology is necessary since the buildings have limited space and it seems a little inappropriate to ask for an apology.

Senator Massey: I disagree. The department should have the numbers for capacity within buildings but now a lot of people are hurting from their slip up.

VPGA Billings: ASNAU can't really do anything about it. These are just silly little words written on a piece of paper that will just end up in the trash when it gets to the President's desk. This is an issue in a completely different department, not ours. I yield my time.

SSA Director Best: We have persistence though. If we keep bringing it up, the admin might acknowledge us and say something.
