The Hualapai Tribe Demographic Analysis

Introduction

This analysis of the Hualapai Tribe was undertaken by the Arizona Rural Policy Institute (ARPI) a unit of the Center for Business Outreach in the W.A. Franke College of Business at Northern Arizona University for the planning department of the Hualapai Tribe. The ARPI has produced the Demographic Profile for Hualapai Tribe, with the latest information available from the 2015 American Community Survey (5-year estimates) American Indian and Alaska Native Tables. This document is provided to Arizona tribes as a product of the EDA University Center Grant provided by the EDA to the Center for Business Outreach at Northern Arizona University.

Since 2010 the American Community Survey (ACS) has been tasked with producing population, demographic and housing unit estimates for the United States on an annual and 5 year series basis. This analysis is entirely based the American Community Survey, 5-year estimate data for the period 2011 to 2015 and is annotated in the document as ACS 2015 (5-year estimates). The 2015 ACS 5-year estimates are based on data collected between January 2011 and December 2015. The data were used to analyze household income, poverty rates, employment, language use and household characteristics for Hualapai Tribe. Only the 5-year estimates are used as this is the only data that is provided for small population areas, the 5 year data represent the average characteristics over the 5-year period.

Demographic characteristics are outlined by three separate levels, the State of Arizona, Mohave County and the Hualapai Tribe. Comparisons between the State of Arizona, and Mohave County serve to provide further levels of comparison when examining demographic characteristics of the tribe. Mohave County was chosen for comparison as most Hualapai tribal lands and communities fall mainly in Mohave County. A smaller percentage of the tribal population is located in Coconino County.

Appendix A contains the margin of error estimates to be used to calculate the range of the estimates for the American Community Survey data.

Population


The population of the Hualapai Tribe decreased by almost one-tenth (-8.6%) from 2010 to 2015; data indicate there were 115 fewer tribal members in 2015. This decrease, however, may not truly reflect the actual change in the tribe between the census periods. The 2010 census is considered the official count, and accounts for only the population within the exterior boundaries of the tribal lands. Conversely, both the State (3.9%) and the County (1.6%) grew slowly between the period 2011 and 2015.

Gender

There are more females (55.7%) than males (44.3%) within the Hualapai Tribe. The percentage of males in the Hualapai Tribe was lower than either the State (49.7%) or the County (49.4%), while females (55.7%) comprised a larger proportion of the population among the Hualapai that either the State (50.3%) or the County (50.6%).

Age


The Hualapai Tribe is dominated by those under 19 years of age. The under-19 year population accounts for 34.2 percent of all tribal members, representing a far larger portion of tribal members than the same age group in the State (27.1%) or Mohave County (21.1%). The fact that more than one-third of the tribe is younger than 19 years of age carries with it some important policy implications. The large portion of younger tribal members influences the provision of health and educational services as well as poverty and workforce issues as well.


Figure 2. Age cohorts for Arizona, Mohave County & the Hualapai Tribe 2011-2015

On the other hand, the tribe has fewer members who are 65 years or older. This age group, those who have retired and are out of the workforce, accounts for only 7.9 percent of tribal members when compared to 15.4 percent for the State and 25.9 percent for the County. These data indicate the overall youthful profile of the tribe. Finally, those age 19 to 64 years account for 57.9 percent of the tribal members, which compares favorably to the State (57.5%) and the County (58.3%). The large number of young tribal members will have an effect on the development of the tribal workforce in the future. See Table 3, and Figure 2. ACS Table S0101 was used to make Table 3.

A population pyramid, also called an age structure diagram, is a graphical illustration that shows the distribution of various age groups in a population (typically that of a country or region of the world), which forms the shape of a pyramid when the population is growing.

The population pyramid below (Figure 3) illustrates the difference between males and females for the 5 year age cohorts in the Hualapai Tribe. The under-19 age cohorts are symmetrical indicating an even number of males and females. At the top of the age pyramid there are more females than males. This is also a demographic reality as women tend to live longer than men. The age pyramid provides an illustrated snapshot of the age/gender structure of tribal members at the time of the 2011-2015 period.

Population Under 19 Years

Children under 19 years of age account for 34.2 percent of all tribal members. Thus, 196 males and 221 female tribal members are under age 19 – representing 36.3 percent of all males and 32.6 percent of all females who are under age 19. More males are under age 5 (31.1%) than females (27.9%), while there are about the same number of males (24.5%) and females (24.8%) between the ages of 5 and 9 years. The sex ratio is lower for the 10 to 14 age cohort, where there are fewer males (20.9%) than females (27.9%). See Table 4. ACS table S0101 was used to create this table.

Median Age

The median age (representing the mid-point of the population, where 50% are above and 50% are below) for Hualapai tribal members is 27 years, with males slightly younger at 26 years and females a bit older at 26 years. The median age of tribal members is ten years younger than the State median (37 years of age) and almost half the median age of the much-older County (49 years). This statistic serves once more to emphasize the relatively young age of tribal members. See Figure 4.

Figure 4. Median age in years 2010



Race

Not surprisingly, the majority of Hualapai tribal members identify themselves as American Indian or Alaska Native alone (88%), while the remaining 12 percent are split between white alone, some other race alone, and multi-race persons. This stands in strong contrast to the State which is 78 percent white alone, and the County which is 89 percent white alone. See Table 6.


Ethnicity


Figure 5. Ethnicity

In terms of ethnicity, a small percentage (4.3%) of Hualapai tribal members self-identify as Hispanic or Latino. This is lower than the surrounding County where 15.6% identify themselves as Hispanic or Latino and much lower than the State where 30.3 percent identify themselves as Hispanic or Latino. See Table 7, and Figure 5.

Households

In 2011-2015, there were 294 households on the Hualapai Tribe, with an average household size of 4.1 persons and an average family size of 4.4 persons. The average household size of 4.1 persons is larger than the State average (2.7 persons) and larger than the County average (2.4 persons). The average family size for tribal members (4.8 persons) is also larger than the State and the County, where the average is 3.3 and 3.0 persons respectively. See Figure 6.

Households

The next section of the demographic profile focuses on households and their structure. The Census defines a "household" as a person or group of people who occupy a housing unit. The "householder" is a person in whose name the housing unit is owned, being bought, or rented. A "family household" consists of a householder and one or more people living together in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption — it may also include people unrelated to the householder. If the householder is married and living with his/her spouse, then the household is designated a "married-couple household." The remaining types of family households not maintained by a married couple are designated by the sex of the householder. A "nonfamily household" consists of a person living alone or a householder who shares the home with nonrelatives only; for example, with roommates or an unmarried partner.


Family households (76.2%) predominate on the Hualapai Tribe, although traditional married couple families are in the minority (31.0%), at rates lower than the State (47.4%) or the County (48.4%). Households headed by a female head of household (single moms) account for more than one-third (37.1%) of all households. Almost two-thirds (68.1%) of all households are either married couple families (31.0%) or households headed by single mothers (37.1%). See Table 8 and Figure 7.

Households with children under age 18 (46.6%) occur in one-third of the households, a much higher rate for the Hualapai Tribe than at the State (28.1%) or the County (18.6%). Households with a member over age 65 account for more than one third (22.8%) of all households, lower than the state (29.0%), and the County (44.2%). Finally, tribal households are more likely to be headed by a single mother with their own children under age 18 (13.3%) almost twice the rate of the State (7.2%) or the County (5.3%).

Figure 7. Household relationships




In terms of household characteristics only 24.7 percent of all Hualapai households are headed by a householder, much lower than the State (37.2%) or County (41.1%). Spouse-headed households comprise a much smaller share of Hualapai tribal households (8.4%) than the State (17.6%) or the County (19.9%). Households containing children comprise more than one-third of all households (35.5%), greater than the State (30.4%) or the County (23.3%). See Table 9 and Figure 8.

Family households dominate among Hualapai tribal members (76%), compared to 66 percent for the State and the County (64%). Non-family households account for one-third (32%) of tribal member households, less than the State (45%) or County (48%). Husband and wife families account for less than one-third (31%) of households, whereas residents of the State (47%) and the County (48%) are more likely to live in husband and wife households. Households on the Hualapai Tribe are three times more likely to be headed by a female householder (37%) with no husband present. Households headed by single mothers are far less prevalent at the State (13.0%) or County (11.0%) levels. Households on the Hualapai Tribe are more likely (30%) to have children under the age of 18 living in the household, than the State (28%) and the County (19%). See Table 10 and Figure 9.

Figure 9. Households headed by single mothers




Children Under 18 Years Age Living with Grandparent

Children under age 18 are twice as likely to live with grandparents on the Hualapai Tribe (5.1%) than they are at the State level (2.5%) or in the County (2.9%). There are few differences between the proportions of children by age living with grandparents; the only exception is that more children 5 or older live with their grandparents (69%) in the Hualapai Tribe than at the State or County levels. Figure 10. Percentage of children under 18 living with a grandparent householder




Household Income

The median household income for the Hualapai Tribe is \$36,250, less than the County (\$38,488) and the State (\$50,255). Tribal members are more likely to have lower household incomes than either the State or the County. In fact, households are almost twice as likely to have incomes of less the \$25,000 (36%) than the State (24%) or the County (31%). Tribal members (27%) have the same level of household incomes between \$25,000 and \$49,999 as the State (26%) but less than the County (32%). Correspondingly, more tribal households have incomes in excess of \$100,000 (11.2%) greater than the County (10.0%) but less than the State (20%). See Table 12 and Figure 11.

Supplemental Income

Households on the Hualapai Tribe are twice as likely (39%) to receive Food Stamps than are residents of the State (14%) and the County (17%). They also tend to have more public assistance income (6%) than the State at large (2%) and the County (3%). See Table 13 and Figure 12.

Figure 12. Supplemental income




Poverty

Poverty rates for the Hualapai Tribe (38%) are twice as high as the State (18%) and the County (20%). Almost half (43%) of all children under 18 years of age are considered to be living in poverty, while one-third (34%) of tribal members between 18 and 64 also live in poverty. One-half (50%) of tribal members over 65 years of age live in poverty, five times the State (9%) and County (8%) rates. See Table 15 and Figure 13.

Children in Poverty

The rates of children under 18 years of age living in poverty on the Hualapai Reservation (30.1%) are the same as the State (30.9%) and higher than the County (27.3%). The highest poverty rates for tribal members are recorded for children between the ages of 5 and 11 years, of whom 15 percent of these school age children live below the poverty line. See Table 16. ACS Table B17001 was used to create this table.

Persons in Poverty

The Census Bureau uses a set of money income thresholds that vary by family size and composition to determine who is poor. If a family's income is less than a family's threshold, then that family and every individual in it, is considered poor. Further the ratio of income to poverty can be used to measure the degree or depth of poverty. The ratio of income to poverty compares a person's income with their poverty threshold, and expresses the comparison as a fraction. For example, a poverty ratio of 1.0 (income at 100% of poverty level) means a person is living right at the poverty line; a ratio of 0.5 (income at 50% of poverty level) would mean that a person is living in a household making only half the income designated as the poverty threshold. The Census Bureau describes those with family incomes below one half of their poverty threshold as being "severely poor." People with incomes at or above their threshold but below 125 percent of their threshold are classified as "near poor."


One-third (38%) of those living on the Hualapai Tribe are classified as "severely poor," with poverty ratios that ranges from below 0.5 to .99. These rates are almost twice those of the State (18%) and higher than the County (20%). A further 7 percent of tribal members are classified as "near poor" with poverty ratios between 1.00 and 1.24. These data indicate that 45 percent of Hualapai households are living in poverty, while the remaining 55 percent are classified as not living in poverty. See Table 17 and Figure 14. Households Receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

Almost two-fifths (39.4%) of all households on the Hualapai Reservation receive assistance from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). This rate is almost three times higher than the State (13.5%) and the County (17.3%). Two-fifths of households receiving SNAP assistance (39.1%) have at least one person in the household over 60 years of age. This rate is higher than the County (6.2%), and more than eight times the State (3.5%) rate. See Table 18. ACS Table S2201 was used to create this table.

Fertility



APPENDIX A: THE HUALAPAI TRIBE AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY 2011-2015, 5-YEAR ESTIMATES MARGIN OF ERROR ESTIMATES

ACS Margin of Error Estimates

The ACS estimates are based on data from a sample of housing units and people in the population, not the full populations. For this reason, ACS estimates have a degree of uncertainty associated with them, called sampling error. In general, the larger the sample, the smaller the level of sampling error. The ACS calculates standard errors for each estimate produced and publishes the 90 percent confidence level margins of error (the Census Bureau standard). You can be 90 percent confident that the interval within the margin of error from the estimate includes the true value. Users can add and subtract the margin of error value from the estimate to find the top and bottom of the range within which the ACS is 90 percent confident that their estimate lies in.

Understanding margin of error

A term you will often come across in survey research is "within the margin of error." Most people hear the term frequently during election season when results from polls are reported. Many surveys and polls collect data from a representative sample of a population to make determinations about a larger population. Results would be somewhat different each time the survey is administered to a different representative sample. The margin of error accounts for these differences by calculating an upper and lower boundary the true result would likely fall between if every member of population was surveyed.

For example, in the case of the Hualapai Tribe the ACS has established that there are 1,220 persons present on the Hualapai Reservation. The survey also indicates that there are 541 males and 679 females in the total population, with a margin of error of plus or minus (±) 106 males and (±) 100 females. See Table 2 margin of error estimates. The margin of error tells us that if the same survey were administered to the Hualapai Tribal members again, it is highly probable that the true population for males would be between 435 and 647 and similarly that the true population of females would be between 579 and 779.
