- **Receive a \$50 stipend for each meeting attended** (Total: \$450 for 9 meetings/year, including forum attendance)
- **Receive mentorship** from Native American public health professionals
- **Build your network and resume** with career-related experience

Student Eligibility Requirements

- Enrolled member of a federally-recognized Native American tribal nation
- Undergraduate student (Junior or Senior status), or a Graduate student (Masters/PhD)
- Pursuing a degree in the fields of public health, biological sciences, clinical sciences, health sciences, environmental health, nutrition, nursing, and related areas
- Attending a university, college, or tribal college in the Four Corners region (AZ, CO, NM, and UT)
- Interest in growing career-related skills in virtual event facilitation, public speaking, marketing/promotions and program evaluation
