Fall 2026 Honors Nonprofit Intern Fellowship

(open to all currently enrolled NAU Honors students)

The Honors College is pleased to accept applications for Fall 2026 Honors Internship Fellowships. Funded through a generous gift, the awards support students in academically meaningful semester-long internships at local and regional nonprofit organizations. The award is \$2,000 per semester for a placement that includes at least the 135 contact hours required to satisfy a three-credit internship course.

Applications are due Sunday, July 5, 2026, by 11:59 PM PDT. The application form is attached to this document. Interested students should note the following:

1. Participants in the Program will be expected to enroll in credit-bearing Honors internship hours (e.g., HON 408 or departmental internship hours contracted for Honors credit) while serving as Fellows.
2. The attached application requires a proposal that includes a description of the work to be completed in the internship, a letter from the supervisor at the internship placement, and a signature from an instructor of record who will evaluate written work and other deliverables.

Internship Proposal

PROMPT: Write an essay of 500 words (single-spaced, 12-point font, one-inch margins) in which you do the following: 1) describe the nonprofit internship placement and the nature of the work to be completed there; 2) detail the academic or professional skills you plan to develop through the internship; 3) outline how the internship fits into your long-term academic and/or career plans, including (as relevant) major requirements or your Honors Capstone; discuss the nature of the written work or other deliverables to be produced through the internship.

This document should be accompanied by a separate letter of approximately 250 words from the internship placement that outlines the following: 1) the work to be done during the internship; 2) the name of the internship supervisor and the nature of the mentorship to be provided; 3) a commitment to recording and confirming internship hours; and 4) a commitment to provide a written evaluation of the intern at the end of the internship.

An unsigned application will be considered invalid.
