Third Year Students (60-89 completed units)

Complete 15 units per term (or speak with your advisor to discuss other options)

Complete 10 dilits per term (or speak with your advisor to discuss other options)
Step One Check to see if your transfer credits have been processed and posted to your unofficial transcript.
 Step Two Meet with your Academic Advisor. Create your course plan that includes the sequence of courses you need to complete in order to earn your degree. Independently check your Academic Advisement Report to ensure your classes are being distributed towards the correct degree requirements. Your Liberal Studies program and University Diversity requirements should be completed by your third year, unless it is fulfilled by your major coursework.
