This is a remarkable opportunity for a passionate and visionary leader to join Northern Arizona University (NAU) as the inaugural Vice President for Inclusion, Diversity, and Engagement (VP IDE). Reporting directly to the President, the VP IDE is a Cabinet-level position with responsibility for advancing university-wide inclusion, diversity, and engagement initiatives at NAU. Building off a solid foundation and university-wide culture committed to advancing DEIJ, the VP IDE will work collaboratively with internal and external constituents to advance the critical work aligned with the Mission-Driven and Diverse Faculty and Staff priority described in the university's strategic plan, *NAU 2025 – Elevating Excellence* with the shared goal of best serving the diverse constituencies of faculty, staff, students, and other partners that make up the rich fabric of the university community.

The successful candidate is a critical thinker able to navigate the complex structural and cultural environments in today's higher education landscape. The ideal candidate is a solutions-oriented leader who takes a proactive, collaborative approach to building an inclusive culture at all levels of the institution in support of the diverse backgrounds and lived experiences of its community.

The components of this priority area reflect the holistic approach NAU envisions for supporting and including all in the university experience and contributing to NAU's elevated excellence:

- Development and evaluation of highly qualified, mission-driven faculty and staff with diverse academic pursuits, experiences, and talents that support, enhance, and connect with the diverse lived experiences of our student community.
- Support faculty and staff economic, physical, and mental well-being to foster a healthy and fulfilled workforce and a mission-driven workplace.
- Support a culture of shared responsibility for inclusion, diversity, and engagement-centered institutional practices to contribute to the NAU community's pursuit of excellence.
- Promote student success with mission-driven faculty and staff collectively supporting the needs of all students through meaningful relationships and experiences, tailored support, accessible environments, and pedagogical excellence.

The VP IDE will be a key university-wide champion for building an inclusive environment that supports the full spectrum of diversity at NAU and acknowledges and supports the experiences of students, faculty, and staff of all racial, ethnic, cultural, and socioeconomic backgrounds, national origins, disabilities, age, veteran status, religious or political beliefs, sexual orientations, gender identities and expression, and lived experiences. Through the efforts of the incumbent to coordinate, support, and lead initiatives that include all voices and backgrounds foster an inclusive and engaged university community, NAU will strengthen its institutional culture and incorporate diversity, equity, inclusion, and justice for all in the pursuit of excellence and the promotion of student success.

A key goal for this position will be to leverage an energized and mobilized university community in coordinating existing groups—including the Diversity Fellows and Diversity Commissions—as well as shaping new developments in areas like the build out of a central, university-wide Center for University Access and Inclusion (CUAI). As the inaugural holder of this position, the VP has a unique opportunity to

shape the infrastructure that will institutionalize and sustain NAU's goals to advance and incorporate the diverse perspectives, backgrounds, and lived experiences of its community into its future work and institutional identity.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Serve as strategic advisor to the President and the President's Cabinet on university-wide inclusion, diversity, and engagement issues and initiatives throughout the university;
- Lead and coordinate cross-divisional and university-wide work to create an inclusive environment for all members of the university and external community;
- Lead the Center for University Access and Inclusion (CUAI), including developing an organizational structure for the center and building its operations to serve as a central organizing hub for inclusion, diversity, and engagement activities across NAU;
- Advance strategic efforts aligned with *NAU 2025 – Elevating Excellence* and the university's *Diversity Strategic Plan* to meet institutional goals;
- Collaborate with, convene, and coordinate existing groups throughout the university, including the Diversity Commissions and Diversity Fellows (whose chairs will report to the VP IDE);
- Represent NAU in both internal and external engagements, activities, and communications focused on inclusion, diversity, and engagement initiatives and leadership.

The higher altitude and shade of the thick forests makes Flagstaff significantly cooler than many other Arizona cities.
