Arizona GEAR UP helps middle and high school students prepare for college and succeed in life beyond high school. A robust Arizona depends on a well-educated workforce, and we believe every Arizona child deserves equal access to higher education.

- Academic performance and college preparation.
- High school graduation and college enrollment rates.
- Educational expectations for students and increase college knowledge for students and families.

### Arizona GEAR UP (2012-2019 grant)

- Cohort Model
- 12 Partner High Schools in rural Arizona
- Worked with Class of 2018 (7<sup>th</sup> grade to 12<sup>th</sup> grade + 1<sup>st</sup> year in college)
- **3,400** students



# Our Partner Schools (2012 – 2019)




• **3,400** students

- Rural
  - 59% Hispanic
  - 27% White
  - 8% Native American
  - 6% all others

- Cohort F/R Lunch rate = 70%
- ESL & IRP rates ~ 10%





# Current Grant Cycle (2019 – 2026)



- Priority Model (previous grants operated on a Cohort Model)
  - 5E's of Equity Engage, Empower, Excel, Elevate, and Enrich

- 41 High Schools (A60 Schools)
  - Prioritize senior-year services
  - 5 of 41 schools direct services from AZGU 9-12<sup>th</sup> grade
  - 36 of 41 schools senior-year services + resources from partner organizations




#### **Launch Guide Utilization (Printed)**

previous school year:



\*AZGU's postsecondary enrollment rate is calculated by dividing the number of students with any postsecondary enrollment one-year post-graduation (2021,2022), divided by the total number of 12th graders enrolled at participating schools with available postsecondary data (Agua Fria HS, Camelback HS, Carl Hayden HS, Casa Grande HS, Catalina HS, Central HS, Cesar Chavez HS, Cholla HS, Desert View HS, Dysart HS, Metro Tech HS, Pueblo HS, Sunnyside HS, and Vista Grande HS).


