II. Approval of the Minutes

Gioia Woods

Prior to moving to the next agenda item Gioia took the opportunity to welcome and introduce the newly elected senators, many of whom were in attendance: Ira Allen (CAL); Michael Caulkins (SBS); Mandy Dang (FCB); Lawrence Lenhart (CAL), Paul Lenze (SBS); Scot Raab (CHHS); Tiffany Redies (SBS); Rick Stamer (CAL); Marieke Taney(SBS); and Lielah Danielson (CAL) who will sub for Alexandra Carpino during her sabbatical. She also announced the dates of the summer senate meetings: June 4th and July 16th. Summer senate meetings are voluntary. Senators who sign up and attend both meetings can use this as their senate committee work which is required of all senators.

III. President's Report

President Cheng

President Cheng reported on the following:

• NAU will confer over 5, 700 degrees to students online and statewide.

- The state budget has been approved after a long legislative session. NAU's Tuition guarantee program will continue (now in its second decade).
- Various campus projects continue on campus: we are in the final phase of the honors college, the work on the recital hall continues, and the remodeling of the science annex will begin this summer.
- She thanked those who have worked on the strategic plan. The committee is working on a communication piece regarding the strategic plan.
- She also thanked Diane Stearns who chaired the task force on proposed changes to CEFNS; and Senators Willie Odem and Benning Tieke who worked on different phases of the task force.
- Dan Kain will step down as Provost effective July 1st. She is working with Dan on a transition to an interim provost. Candidates for an interim provost will be selected from the registry. The registry consists of recently retired campus executives. The president is working with Gioia to ensure faculty and chairs are aware of the sessions available to meet with the candidates. All sessions will be in the Grand Canyon room of the University Union. All candidates will be on campus at the same time. She expects the term for this position will be twelve to thirteen months starting July 1st.
- Convocations, commissioning, and commencement celebrations are proceeding this week.
- Two student were named as US Fulbright winners. These student awards along with others reflect well not only on the students but also to the faculty and academics at NAU.

IV. Provost's Report

Provost Kain

Provost Kain Reported on the following

- Dan reminded all of the important role faculty have in maintaining enrollment numbers.
 Recently NAU has seen a narrowing of the gap in continuing enrollment. He encouraged all to help where they can on this important task.
- The university has created a policy portal which was designed to place all NAU policies in one location so there is only one version of each document. Included in the portal are the COFS and Faculty Handbook as well as policies under consideration.
- President Cheng issued a memo to alumni regarding a Gallup survey requesting feedback about their experiences at NAU.
- He is working with the ACC on a report that will look at ways to improve scheduling.
- ABOR will convene its June 14-15 meeting at NAU where they will continue the quality discussion which will culminate in a self-study and program review of liberal studies. He thanked everyone for their amazing work on behalf of NAU.
- Dan reiterated that enrollment numbers for fall continue to be down from last year. However, every day the gap is narrowing.

Upon completion of Dan's report FS Past President Bruce Fox presented Dan with a roast followed by a certificate of appreciation and a few gifts for his service to NAU in his many roles.

V. Scholarship Announcement

VI. Ombuds Office Update

Gene Moan NAU Ombudsman addressed the senate by announcing the selection of Bruce Fox as the next NAU Ombudsman. The search committee for this position was headed by Roger Bounds

and consisted of himself, Cyndi Anderson and Bill Culbertson. The search began February 7th, four candidates applied. The position is a 3 year appointment which can be renewed.

VII. ACC Task Force on Best Practices in Centralized Scheduling

Anne Scott

Anne Scott, a member of the ACC Task Force on Best Practices in Centralized scheduling presented their report. The report includes a list of 14 guidelines to improve the process. Some of these are small recommendations, some are much larger such as: increased staffing, decentralization, improving training, and reducing mistakes. It is hoped that a working group will be assembled by the interim provost and some of the recommendations can be implemented so next year is smoother.

VIII. Engineering Task Force Update

Benning Tieke

The task force on proposed changes to CEFNS is now in its final phases how to split the current college into two separate colleges and how to move forward. One of the most contentious issues was naming the colleges. At this time one college is using the name CEIAS - The College of Engineering, Informatics, and Applied Science which will include: Civil Engineering; Construction Management and Environmental Engineering; Mechanical Engineering; and the school of Informatics, Computing and Cyber Systems. The second college's name is not determined but will consist of the natural sciences and six centers and institutes. The first phase is splitting, second phase is appropriate level of academic support, third will be research support. At this time there is a major effort to have a proposal ready by May 16th so it can go to ABOR for approval. There is still much work to be done.

IX. Awards Acknowledgements and Elections
